Rev. Donald Castro

Rimban Emeritus, Seattle Betsuin Buddhist Temple
Founder, EcoSangha Movement

Educated at San Jose State University (BA) and the Institute of Buddhist Studies (MA), Rev. Castro has served temples in the Bay Area, Seattle and the greater Pacific Northwest. Describing the EcoSangha Movement, he says, *“To be a Buddhist is automatically to be both an ecologist and a conservationist. . . . Buddhism is not just ecology, however. Ecology is science and Buddhism goes beyond science. Being based on a medical model (the four noble truths) Buddhists are always working for a cure. Ecologists tell us the world is in peril from many sources; conservationists seek a cure. This is why Buddhists are both ecologists and conservationists.”*
