usic has been in my life since birth. I remember my mom singing "Three Little Fishes" even though my sister swears mom couldn't carry a tune. My dad sang at any event and later in life did Karaoke and Shigin. I played clarinet, the last of the family to use the metal clarinet. I sang in grade school and even in the specialty group. Both of those things carried over to high school and even a madrigal group in college.

Growing up, while in scouts we made our own song books so we had all the camp songs. My sister gave me a copy of her folk song lyrics which I added to my songbook. My dad and other Dharma School teachers did parody songs for different events; ministers leaving or coming, Dharma School Coordinator retiring, conventions, etc. Decades later we did the same thing and added them to Hanamatsuri programs.

While I knew we had talented people in the Sangha, I really didn't think about it since it was so hard to get groups together like other temples. People came and left and I took taiko with Rev. Julie Hanada, and a couple of things on the ukulele at district conventions. 
anniversary of our organizing meetings around Labor Day weekend each year — we just turned 3 years old!

Picture the Buddha Picture the Buddha.

Candles burning bright, Offerings of incense, Flowers, rice,

Listen to the Dharma, hear the gong.

Following the teachings, won't you come along.

One day I hope to find someone to fill in the harmony and music on some other songs.

We were very fortunate to have Wynn Kiyama in our Sangha who not only did taiko, but wrote the history of Obon dance in America. While living in New York, Wynn was fortunate to meet and study classic Japanese dance with renowned Sahomi Tachibana. Sadly he and his family have moved to Oahu for family and some new adventures. During his tenure in Portland, Wynn recruited Sangha members, including his wife Traci and sister-in-law Jenna Yokoyama to not only write but choreograph our own Portland Ondo.

Sangha member, Chris Dart, is a retired tech person and wears many temple hats. She is our very talented and dedicated Obon dancer, who under the tutelage of Sahomi Tachibana, personal education in Japan, and many hours of study online, has started a monthly dance group as our new Obon Sensei. She tirelessly leads the Obon classes starting three weeks prior to Obon and does the scout education for the BCA scouting Obon patch. Chris recruited her granddaughter to Zoom the practices and record the dances at Obon which you can find on our website:

Chris even provided Obon during the pandemic so we could do a virtual Obon.

She and Donna Sasaki had written and arranged several pieces of work and introduced them to the temple via our Northwest District conventions and Dharma School teacher seminars. Such occasions brought me the ultimate opportunity of celebrating the 850th Birthday of Shinran Shonin and 17th World Buddhist Women's Conference where I sang on stage with 20 other BWA members from the United States.


BCA Music Committee Sponsorship/Donations
